

The Story of Macbeth

Macbeth, the well respected Thane of Glamis, is on his way home from victorious battle with a traitor to Scotland. He and Banquo come upon witches who make the prophecy that Macbeth will become first Thane of Cawdor and then King of Scotland. They also tell Banquo that his descendants will be kings. Soon after Macbeth is made Thane of Cawdor. He sends this news by letter to his wife who is equally ambitious.

When King Duncan (Macbeth's cousin) comes to stay the night at their castle, the perfect opportunity arrives for them to murder him and blame his sons Malcolm and Donaldbain. This completed, Macbeth becomes King, but this brings little joy. He fears Banquo because of the witches' prophecy and arranges his murder. The other generals of Scotland such as Macduff begin to suspect foul play especially after Macbeth sees the ghost of Banquo at a royal banquet and reveals his guilty conscience.

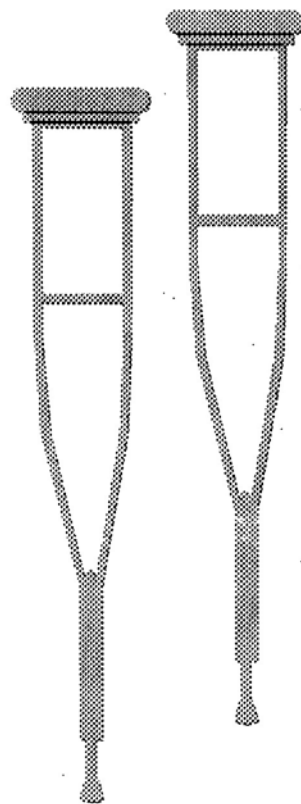
Macbeth seeks out the witches again to learn more about the future. They present for him three visions which tell him:

- 1) Beware Macduff the Thane of Fife
- 2) None of woman born can harm Macbeth
- 3) Macbeth shall never be defeated till Birnam Wood moves to Dunsinane Castle.

Macbeth takes heart at these revelations but is horrified when the witches still present Banquo's descendants as kings. Wanting to be sure of his own safety, Macbeth arranges the murder of Lady Macduff and her children. Meanwhile Macduff and other officers join forces with Malcolm and Donaldbain to defeat Macbeth. In order to proceed towards Dunsinane Castle undetected, the soldiers are ordered to cut down foliage from Birnam Wood and carry it before them as camouflage. Unfortunately for Macbeth, the prophecies he relied on have double meanings.

Lady Macbeth has become riddled with guilt and she sleepwalks, unable to cleanse her hands of the blood. Eventually she commits suicide as the forces rally against Macbeth. As he duels with Macduff he clings to the thought that "none of woman born can harm him", until Macduff reveals that he was born by caesarean - ("Macduff was from his mother's womb untimely ripped"). With nothing left to lose, Macbeth is slain by Macduff and Malcolm restored to the throne of Scotland.

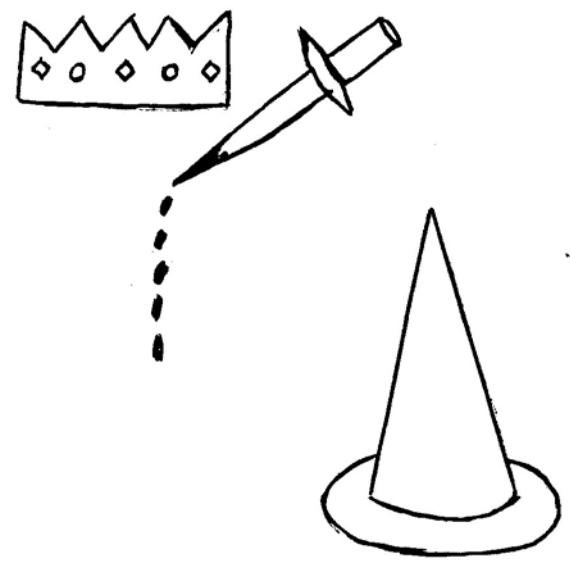
